Action for Children supported his education and career goals, leading to a qualification and his first job. Today, he feels safe, valued and optimistic about a brighter future.

Standing up for children facing poverty

Poverty remains one of the greatest challenges facing children in the UK. The latest official child poverty statistics published this year show that 4 million children are currently growing up in poverty. Children in single-parent families, larger families and households affected by disability are particularly vulnerable, while many families struggle to afford essentials such as food, heating and clothing. It is worrying that many children living in poverty belong to working families, highlighting that employment alone does not guarantee financial security.

With the help of our devoted supporters, Action for Children provides practical support through more than 300 services across the UK. By supporting families today and campaigning for the long-term changes needed to address the root causes of poverty, we are ensuring that every child has the opportunity to thrive. Breaking down barriers to employment for care-experienced young people

Action for Children conducted some research with the John Lewis Partnership Foundation's support to highlight the challenges care-experienced young people seeking employment face.

Our research found that a quarter (25%) of care-experienced respondents did not have ID documentation, such as a passport or driving licence to prove their right to work in the UK. It also highlighted other practical barriers that can prevent them from getting their first job, including suitable work clothing, digital technology and affordable transport.

Action for Children runs employability programmes that provide practical support, such as tailored mentoring and job coaching. But the UK government needs to do more. In our report, we recommend ways the government can help remove employment barriers and provide greater support for care-experienced young people.
