Safeguarding Sunday 2025 - The Communications pack has now been launched.

Safeguarding Sunday 2025 is on **16 November 2025** – Publicity says: 'Defending the rights of vulnerable people is integral to Christian faith and teaching. Sadly, the church hasn't always done this well. But we have a chance to change that. We are already seeing many churches take the responsibility to safeguard those in their care seriously. The theme this year is – 'Action speaks louder!' It's time to move beyond just talking about creating safer places, and take action towards doing it!'
