About Easter Offering

Each year, the Methodist Church holds an Easter Offering dedication service. This tradition dates back to 1883, when women in Manchester collected £32 for missionary work overseas from 'Christmas pennies' at family gatherings on Christmas Day. In March 1884, the London Districts distributed Easter envelopes and collecting bags asking for a penny a head, and collected around £100. In 1900, Women's Work raised £1,655 for the work of overseas missions.

Since then, each successive Methodist women's movement has encouraged donations in support of God's mission. Recently, Methodist Women in Britain (supported by the Global Relationships team) have produced an annual service of dedication, often used widely around the Connexion as a circuit service.

All the money raised through the Easter Offering goes to the World Mission Fund of the Methodist Church in Britain for work in our Partner Churches around the world.

Since Methodist Women in Britain began in 2011 over £3 million has been raised for the World Mission Fund.

Whose Bag is it Anyway....?

This joint project between Methodist Women in Britain and Touchstone is funded by World Day of Prayer. It builds on our shared work to develop understanding between all people, especially supporting the advancement and abilities of women to fulfil their potential. There are a series of events happening during 2022 and 2023 focussing on faith perspectives on caring for creation and the environment.

RESOURCING AND ENABLING WOMEN AROUND THE WORLD

This year (2021) Methodist Women in Britain donated £10,000 in **empowerment gifts** to projects in Argentina, Cameroon, Columbia, Northern Nigeria and Sierra Leone.

In 2019 we sent Africa Greater Life Mission U.K. (AGLM) an empowerment gift. They used it to bless Sharon in Uganda (pictured). Mary Gill, Northampton Forum Rep, shares with us the difference it has made.

'Sharon is from Kamuli, a rural community north of Jinja in Uganda, an area with high levels of poverty and little in the way of educational opportunities. Sharon hasn't seen her mother since she was about five years old and her grandparents (the main carers) and her father have died.

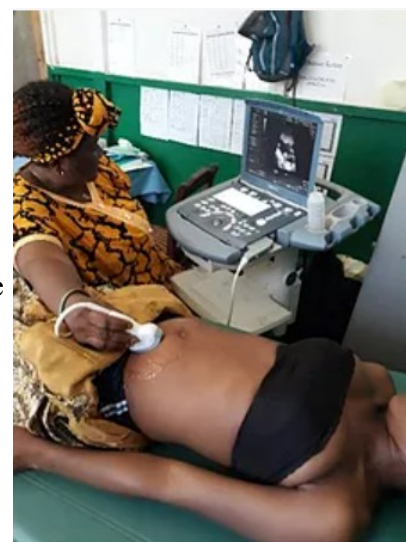


Her schooling had been erratic until 2012 when, aged 14, following a recommendation from her local church, Sharon moved to Wakiso Town with AGLM, completing her primary and secondary education with their support.

At first Sharon couldn't find work and helped her aunt, a hairdresser, to earn money to send her children to school. Eventually, she did find some work in micro finance but wanted more training to enable her to progress. Our empowerment gift helped Sharon to enrol in a Diploma in Records, Bookkeeping and Information management. She continues to work and studies at weekends.'

And in 2020 an empowerment gift proposed by Stamford Methodist Church enabled the Friends of Nixon Memorial Hospital in Sierra Leone to donate an ultrasound machine. The introduction of this new service allows women to know an approximate due date and to identify any potential issues. As a result more women are choosing to have their antenatal care and subsequent labour care at the hospital.

The key staff involved provided positive feedback on the opportunity to develop a new skill and the impact it was beginning to have on the women they looked after.

Thursdays in Black

A global movement for a world without rape and violence

The Thursdays in Black campaign began in the 1970's inspired by the Mothers of the Disappeared in Argentina who gathered quietly wearing black, or black sashes, every Thursday during the military dictatorship in protest at the loss of their loved ones. Many young men disappeared, and women were raped and abused. Women still gather there on Thursdays.

Other groups in later years expressed their outrage when violent acts of rape and death occurred, for example during the Bosnian war, and the Black Sash movement in South Africa. Individual women also expressed their opposition to gender based violence across the world.

In the 1980's #ThursdaysinBlack grew to a peaceful, global campaign, supported by the World Council of Churches. The aim is to work towards a world without violence, rape and fear, by helping to change attitudes that cause the aggression.

The campaign gained strength in 2008 during the South African 16 Days of Activism campaign launched by the Diakonia Council of Churches to raise awareness of the violence against women and children. During the pandemic the level of violence against women and children has increased significantly across the world. Therefore this campaign is more relevant than ever, and we encourage everyone, men as well as women, to **wear Black on Thursdays**.

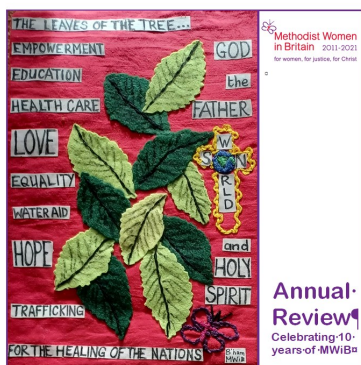
